It is the school's aim to provide for any child wishing to learn a musical instrument the opportunity to do so. At times, particularly at the beginning of a year, there may be a demand for uptake of an instrument that cannot be accommodated. If this is the case, your child will be placed on a waiting list and you will be contacted as soon as a place becomes available. The signing, dating and returning of the enclosed Music Home-School Contract is your commitment to going ahead with lessons. This needs to be returned as soon as possible. You will be contacted by the school to confirm a place has been offered. Please wait for this confirmation before you organise the purchase or hire of an instrument.

THE PROMPT RETURNING OF THIS PAPERWORK WILL HELP IN SECURING YOUR CHILD'S PLACE.

This year, we are again asking that children commit to a year's worth of tuition. I strongly believe a significant amount of time is necessary to master the basics of any instrument and this means practice and some determination, but the rewards will be reaped!

We have a charging policy. The school 'buys in' its instrumental teaching hours from the Dorset Music Service and, if appropriate, employs teachers on a private basis. The children will receive 30 lessons per year (approximately 10 per term) and the approximate cost this year will be £50.00 per term. This price will be confirmed when we have finished discussions with the peripatetic teachers. The cost per child depends on the total amount of children learning. The lessons will be 30 minutes long.

Lessons generally happen in school time on a rotated timetable. This means that a child's lesson will always be on the same day but at a different time each week. However, where there are only a few children learning a particular instrument, and the timetable cannot be rotated, the lesson may need to happen during lunchtime, before or after school.

There will be no lessons in the first and last week of the year. Please note that we will try to fit in as many lessons as possible in the autumn and spring terms, and the children will have fewer lessons in the summer term. Our school is a busy school in the summer term, with many residential trips, performances and sporting events, which might clash with the children's lessons, therefore, it makes sense to schedule these earlier in the year.

The children will be in groups of 3-4. These groups offer greater opportunities to develop their musical skills, e.g. ensemble playing, improvisation skills, aural skills and putting the music making in context. It also is hugely beneficial for a child to have this musical experience together and helps with practice, motivation etc. This is reviewed termly.

Children's attendance at lessons will be monitored. If a child is not attending lessons regularly, parents will be contacted and the child's place put at risk and in some cases stopped. We regret that lessons missed due to absence from school and school activities cannot be made up at a later date. Every support will be given to the children in making them aware of their instrumental times. Due to the impact on your child's curriculum we are stipulating one instrument per child.

When your child has learnt the key basics of their instrument they will be invited and strongly encouraged to join a group.

Practice and progress will be monitored. If you have any concerns regarding your child's instrumental tuition, you should make immediate contact with the Music Subject Leader so any problems can be dealt with promptly.

<u>Children will need to obtain their own instruments</u>. They are obviously required to bring their instrument, music etc. to each lesson. They are also required to take the instrument home at the end of the day; this encourages regular practice and safe keeping of instruments.

- We now offer the opportunity for lessons to be paid for via the Internet. Please contact the office if you do not have a pupil link code for your child.
- The autumn term must be paid for when you agree to the lessons and return the contact in May.

Please ensure that all monies are put into the money post box in the front reception of the school office. The preferred payment method is by cheque for the initial payment with subsequent payments being paid online.
