

# **PUPIL PREMIUM FUNDING ELIGIBILITY**

As a school our budget is increasingly being squeezed by the government.

One way of us generating extra funding is for all pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium funding to actually apply for it. If you think you may be eligible you can check the criteria at <a href="https://www.poole.gov.uk/PupilPremium">www.poole.gov.uk/PupilPremium</a>. Please note in fact that this form can be used for all year groups. You will also find this information on the reverse of the application form. Application forms are available from either the school office or the Borough website. All completed forms should be returned to Free School Meals and Education Transport, Dolphin Centre, Poole, BH15 1SA.

All pupils who are eligible and apply will receive a school uniform subsidy, day and residential visit subsidies and free educational resources (e.g. books, phonics flashcards). Access to additional tuition, whether 1-1 or as part of small groups, is also possible.


We very much appreciate your support in ensuring your child wears the proper uniform.

# **Road Safety**

The Chair of governors and I will be meeting with Nick Ellis from the council to discuss the transport issues around St. Mary's and looking for ways to try and make it as safe as possible for all our pupils.

This meeting has been arranged in response to a parent writing to our Governors and asking them to look at the road safety issue on the roads surrounding our school. We will keep you all updated with this.

On the same theme please can I remind you that we operate a drop off system in the morning to allow parents to drive up to school and not have to worry about parking.

Please drive into the school slowly (5mph) and drop your child off in the drop off zone.

Please do not park on the left hand side of Devon Road as you are coming up to school or do turns in the middle of the road as this causes concerns for the safety of our children.

Finally please can I ask you to be considerate to our neighbours in Devon Road and the surrounding residential area. Thank you for your continued support.

# **First Day Contact**

First day contact will be made with parents if a child is absent and the reason has not been communicated to school. This should in no way be considered to be intrusive or a nuisance, it is purely to ensure the safety and well-being of all our children.

# **Attendance**

Poole Borough Council have re-organised their attendance provision for schools and we have been allocated Jan Traynor who will be working closely with our school and our parents.

Her focus will be around those who are persistently absent from school, those for whom attendance has dropped below 95% and those who are late into school in the mornings.

As you know attendance figures are monitored closely by the Department for Education and hopefully the support that Poole Borough are offering will enable us to provide the support you may need.

# Coughs & sneezes, vomiting bugs etc!

Whilst we continue to improve attendance we have to acknowledge that we are still in the season of germs! Please may we remind parents and carers of the 48



hour rule which is particularly important at this time of year.

If your child has suffered a tummy upset please do not send him/her to school until 48 hours after the last symptom. If you are aware that sickness has been caused by something other than a bug, (for example too much party food!) please ensure you inform the class teacher as in such instances the 48 hour rule does not apply!

If your child is suffering from a cough, cold or any illness that allows them to be in school medicated we are happy to administer **prescribed** medicine in school, if it requires giving 4 times a day, and we will ask that you complete a form with detailed instructions beforehand.
