- will have better informed parents through feedback from their PPV representatives [this is usually organised with the Headteacher, in the form of an article in a regular newsletter, parents` association meeting etc]

## **Poole Parents Voice .....**

- arranges for speakers to attend meetings so that parents gain information, eg on education funding, exam results, new proposed policies, special educational needs
- discusses these issues and feeds back the views of parents to speakers, many of whom are involved in developing new policies in Poole
- ensures, through the use of Poole Parents Voice representatives on other committees, that parents views are regularly considered and listened to by the Local Authority
