Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to take the opportunity to update you on the life of the school this week. After the drama of last week's weather there has been even more than normal to fit into the time available.

Back at school now we have had the visit of Olympic swimmer Joe Roebuck inspiring the pupils as we run up towards Sports Relief Day, a Foundation Stage open afternoon to look forward to on Monday the 19th March at 2:30 p.m. and of course a DIPPY DINOSAUR ART DAY here in school from 10 a.m. on Saturday 10th March; absolutely everyone welcome-the P.T.A. will be here to support the school; my thanks again to this tireless group who work so hard behind the scenes.

The bright lights of London town called for Y6 during the annual visit to the Houses of Parliament in Westminster.
