Dear Parents and Carers,

I would like to take the opportunity to update you on Mrs. Armstrong's health and the life of the school this week. Mrs. Armstrong is feeling better and continues to recover at home. As the summer term continues, it is important to remember the importance of correct uniform. Our policy for this can be found on the website but the following points should also be noted:

- * Simple, plain coloured hairbands without accessories attached please.
- * No black cardigans please.
- * No wristbands please.
- * Trainers are not to be worn at school, into school or home from school please.

As the weather improves the children will be encouraged to wear protective hats and sunglasses if they wish. The responsibility for looking after these remains with your child; please ensure that all items have a clear label. Sun cream should be applied at home before the start of the school day. Thank you for your cooperation in these matters.

Finally, I would like to share with you a story from a child in Year 2. She has been practising her tables using "Hit The Button" which is free, effective and requires no extra adult help to use.
