The Governors have written to the Borough about their concerns for the safety of the children at St. Mary's on the roads surrounding school.

One of our parents has also written to them suggesting that closer monitoring needs to take place before a serious accident happens. We would welcome you also writing to the Borough to support our case.

#### Thank you to those who do drive slowly and park appropriately and safely, it is very much appreciated.

When dropping off at school in the morning please could we ask that you drive into the school, not stopping on the hazards, then drop your child off. They can then walk up the steps by the office and along the path to get into school. By doing this it should mean that 4 or 5 cars could all drop at the same time and hopefully will make it quicker for you all.

#### Attendance

Please be reminded that, unless there are **EXCEPTIONAL** circumstances the school is not legally allowed to authorise term time holidays. We now have a LA form to request absence, please collect one from the school office if necessary.

If your child's attendance is 90% or less then they are officially classified as 'Persistently Absent'. We are currently working with the Borough of Poole to improve the attendance of these pupils.

The attendance of your child is also affected if they are late to school in the morning. Please could all families make sure that their child is in school before **school starts at 8.50am**. Thank you for supporting us to improve our attendance record.

#### Mini Vinnies at St Mary's



Our Mini Vinnies meet up once a week to identify and help those in need within our school and local community. They pray as part of each meeting, undertake an achievable project that will make a difference in the lives of the poor, isolated or marginalised, learn and develop into more socially aware and responsible adults, fundraise for St Vincent de Paul, visit the elderly and other activities which they love to be involved with.

#### St Mary's British Values

Following a visit from an ex-member of parliament to the school, 14 children from Y6 made their way to London at the start of the month in order to visit the Palace of Westminster. Accompanied by a Governor, they used the knowledge gained from their previous meeting to really gain a deeper insight into how our parliamentary system works.

The children observed a live debate in both chambers of the house, were given a tour of the central lobby (plus ceremonial areas) and saw direct evidence of an extraordinarily dense weight of history from the tradition of holding an MP as hostage at Buckingham Palace to a statue damaged during a suffragette protest in the halls.

Having been given an informative and challenging level of information within the Palace itself, the next stage of the day involved the children using interactive voting technology to demonstrate their grasp of the differences between local, regional and national governance. Sadly, our scheduled meeting with the Robert Syms, MP for Poole, did not take place.

A final stop at the gift shop before catching a jam packed train out of Waterloo brought the day itself to a conclusion. In the new year the children will be carrying on their work in this area by using a loan box of parliamentary items to hold a series of debates across the school; look out for more information on this shortly. #### Coughs & sneezes, vomiting bugs etc!

We have been advised by the Borough of Poole to remind parents and carers of the 48 hour rule which is particularly important at this time of year.



If your child has suffered a tummy upset please do not send him/her to school until 48 hours after the last symptom. If you are aware that sickness has been caused by something other than a bug, please ensure you inform the class teacher as in such instances the 48 hour rule does not apply! If your child is suffering from a cough or cold we are happy to administer **prescribed** medicine in school but will ask that you complete a form with detailed instructions beforehand.

#### **First Day Contact**

First day contact will be made with parents if a child is absent and the reason has not been communicated



to school. This should in no way be considered to be intrusive or a nuisance, it is purely to ensure the safety and well-being of all our children.
