
Early Bird's Breakfast Club

Home/School Communication

We are continually working to improve communication between home and school as it is as important to us as it is to you to get it right. Here are some of the things we have put in place:

- KS2 staff will, whenever possible; take years 3 5 to the playground at the end of the school day. Parents will be encouraged to see this as an opportunity to get to know the teacher.
- PHSE lessons will continue to develop children's sense of resilience, responsibility, conflict resolution, and emotional intelligence. The Pastoral Care Worker will continue the program to support small groups such as the "Busy Bees".
- Mr Howard is working on an action research project on successful transition from Year 6 to Year 7 and we will continue to put things in place to support a smooth transition to secondary school
- We will introduce coffee mornings after year group liturgies and masses to enable parents to support each other and meet with the Pastoral Care Worker.
- The model adopted for transition from key stage 1 to 2, (offering short early morning, twilight and evening sessions), be repeated where viable. The next one will be for Foundation Stage Parents.
- Termly surgery opportunity for parents to look at progress in books will be provided "Open Book Evenings". With a 'Meet and Greet' being offered at the beginning of term.
- Homework diaries be recognised as the easiest way to flag up minor concerns between parent and teacher before they grow into significant ones. Diaries will be checked and signed weekly by the teachers.
- The use of the website and twitter will be promoted to provide guidance, support and information to parents.
- Weekly information letters to parents from each year group will be provided.

Congratulations to all the children and staff at St. Mary's for achieving the Primary Science Quality Mark Gold Award. Our staff and children all worked hard last year for this award and our hard work has paid off!

Primary Science Quality Mark (PSQM) is the only national award scheme to develop and celebrate the quality of science teaching and learning in primary schools. Schools achieve a PSQM award through a year-long process of initial audit, followed by action and reflection. "Gaining a Primary Science Quality Award is a significant achievement for a school. The profile and quality of science teaching and learning in each awarded school is very high. Children are engaging with great science both in and outside the classroom, developing positive attitudes towards science as well as



secure science understanding and skills. Science subject leaders, their colleagues, head teachers, children, parents and governors should be very proud."
