Road Safety

Thank you to those who do drive slowly and park appropriately and safely, it is very much appreciated.

When dropping off at school in the morning please could we ask that you drive into the school, not stopping on the hazards, then drop your child off. They can then walk up the steps by the office and along the path to get into school. By doing this it should mean that 4 or 5 cars could all drop at the same time and hopefully will make it quicker for you all.

Attendance

The Attendance Officer, Mrs Preece from the Borough of Poole, continues to work with us to improve our whole school attendance data.

This week she visited school with the family outreach worker to discuss all the children whose attendance is less than 95%. As a result, we will be sending out letters to parents offering help and support to try and improve attendance figures. Mrs Preece will also be inviting individual parents in for meetings and will be monitoring children who arrive in late to school.

Did you know: there is clear evidence of a link between poor attendance at school and low levels of achievement: of pupils who miss between 10% and 20% of school, only 35% manage to achieve five A* to C GCSEs, including English and maths.

Every minute counts! Below is a graph showing how being late to school **everyday** over a school year adds up to lost learning time.


If your child is suffering from a cough or cold we are happy to administer prescribed medicine in school but will ask that you complete a form with detailed instructions beforehand.

RE

In RE this week, our focus for learning and asking questions has been on the faith of Judaism. This week we had a visit from Lynda Ford-Horne, a practising Jew.

Lynda spoke to Y1, Y2 and Y3, sharing the routines of what happens in a Jewish home on a Friday night, the eve of the

Sabbath. Lynda also told us about how boys and men dress when they go to the synagogue and how the Torah is read. Y4 had excellent questions for Lynda. They listened very respectfully about the importance of the Torah and Yom Kippur. The focus for Y5 and Y6 was repentance and Shabbat. Lynda talked about the ritual for the start of Shabbat and the significance that this brings to the lives of the Jewish people. The children found the talk stimulating and had the opportunity to ask lots of questions.
