The power of Novenas

Just before his Ascension, Jesus tells his disciples to stay in the city of Jerusalem "until you are clothed with the power from on high" (Lk 24:49); for "not many days from now, you are going to be baptised with the Holy Spirit" (Acts 1:5)

Jesus didn't tell them exactly how long it would be before the Holy Spirit would come; he obviously wanted them to exercise prayerful trust in him. Those nine days of waiting from the day after Ascension to the vigil of Pentecost have become a model of prayer

for us. A novena, from the Latin for nine, is a special sort of prayer that we use in particular moments of need.

There are hundreds of different popular novena prayers reflecting the fact that powerful answers have been received in this way. Jesus tells his disciples that some things can only be obtained — or devils cast out — by concerted prayer (and fasting). Certainly praying for something over the course of several days or sometimes weeks focuses our hearts and makes us more aware of our need for God's help. It also makes us more appreciative and grateful when God actually gives us what we ask for.

How should we pray a novena? First we can find an appropriate prayer from our prayer-books or online. Second it can fuel-inject our novena if we try to get to mass and receive Holy Communion for each of those nine days. Lastly, we shouldn't forget gratitude. We don't appreciate a sense of entitlement in others; God surely prefers not to see it in his sons and daughters either! We can well imagine the joyful gratitude of the disciples when the Promised Holy Spirit appeared, giving them far more than even they asked for.
