Please think how you would feel if it was your child being named on a social site.



Did you know: there is clear evidence of a link between poor attendance at school and low levels of achievement: of pupils who miss between 10% and 20% of school, only 35% manage to achieve five A* to C GCSEs, including English and Maths. **Every minute counts!** Below is a graph showing how being late to school everyday over a school year adds up to lost learning time.

Healthy School

Please can we remind you that in line with our Healthy Eating Policy all children must have water in their drinking bottles which they have with them during the lesson time.

Also if your child brings in a snack for break time this must be fresh fruit or vegetables. We know that children like to bring in treats for their friends on their birthday. Please can we remind you that wrapped sweets such as 'Haribo' are acceptable and will be given out at the end of the day so you as the parent can decide if you would like your child to have them on that day.

Coughs & sneezes, vomiting bugs etc!

We have been advised by the Borough of Poole to remind parents and carers of the 48 hour rule which is particularly important at this time of year.

If your child has suffered a tummy upset please do not send him/her to school until 48 hours after the last symptom. If you are aware that sickness has been caused by something other than a bug, please ensure you inform the class teacher as in such instances the 48 hour rule does not apply!

If your child is suffering from a cough or cold we are happy to administer **prescribed** medicine in school but will ask that you complete a form with detailed instructions beforehand.



First Day Contact

First day contact will be made with parents if a child is absent and the reason has not been communicated to school.

This should in no way be considered to be intrusive or a nuisance, it is purely to ensure the safety and well-being of all our children.
