Monsignor Robert Draper's reflections on the Third Sunday in ordinary time.

Jonah 3.1-5, 10 Psalm 24 1Corinthians 7.29-31 Mark 1.14-20

It is interesting that the author of the book of Jonah states: 'Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord'. The same author has recorded that Jonah ran away when the summons first came. Jonah's obedience was not instinctive - running away was!

The Gospel today records another group of people called by the Lord by the Sea of Galilee - these did not run away initially - but they did later!

Paul - the author of our second reading today - similarly had a volte-face in his career as disciple.

Those who (perhaps even unwillingly) hear the call and respond are not robbed of their free will, or of their fear of the consequences. The weakness and the frailty of human beings are not an obstacle to God's call, and failing to follow or running away need not be definitive.

The words Jesus speaks to the fishermen are words of invitation, the only power Jesus uses is the power of his personality, and as the Gospel demonstrates that power is attractive to all sorts of people who encounter him and are changed. That, of course, is still the reality today. The Lord attracts people through words

and actions, but those words and actions are so often expressed through those who have already responded to his call - like Jonah and the disciples and Paul.

The Christian faithful called today to enable people to encounter Jesus have no other power or authority than that of the invitation of the one who walked by the Sea of Galilee.
