I would also like to share with you some further details of the school's continuing journey to self-improvement. Last Friday a member of the school's governing body spent the whole day observing lessons, talking to children about their work and engaging with them on the playground. Next week will see subject leaders visit lessons, scrutinise books and talk to pupils about their work. Alongside this process, the review of governance continues to look at the areas for improvement which were identified by the inspection. I will update you as soon as any more relevant information becomes available and would also like to thank Mrs. Betts and Mrs. Rushton in particular for the enormous amount of work they have put into this process.

Another change you may notice in the school is that the office staff are moving in order to facilitate more effective working practice. Mrs. Jones will be pleased to answer your office enquiries in order that Mrs. Hazell can continue her support of the Senior Leadership Team without interruption.

Finally, some highlights from this week. Mrs. Wright has run a truly fantastic Fair Trade Week which has not only engaged the children but also prompted some real reflection on the position of privilege that we are in as a society. It has also been fantastic to see the progress of our Y6 children who continue to come in voluntarily before school for extra arithmetic lessons; my thanks to the Y6 Team who facilitate this and also give up their lunchtimes every day of the week to help any children who need academic support. I have also been visited by a stream of children from EYFS & KS1 who are intent on proving to me their success in counting on in twos and instant recall of 2, 5 and 10 times tables facts including division.

Their enthusiasm and humour are as welcome as the Spring sunshine.
