"Build your house on rock"

Jesus says these words in a famous parable and that's what he did himself! He gives Simon the name rock (Peter) and tells him he's building his community on him; that the gates of hell will not prevail against it. Jesus assures him that after he has recovered from denying him, his faith will not fail. St Peter is rocky because Jesus the God-man is the ultimate rock.

Pope Pius XII announced in 1950 that recent excavations had uncovered St Peter's tomb. It lies directly below the main altar in St Peter's basilica in Rome. Archaeologists had discovered a series of shrines built over each-other through the centuries. (It's fascinating to see these excavations for yourself by booking a tour of the Scavi). In the very centre were the fragments of bones folded in tissue with gold decorations tinted with precious murex purple. The symbolism of our most famous Church being built over the 'rock' of those bones is pretty unique.

After the famous encounter with the risen Jesus on the road to Damascus, Paul not only gets his physical sight back, but also becomes a far-seeing Christian. Jesus chooses him as the first to spread the gospel to the world; 'apostle to the Gentiles'.

In 2006 it was announced that archaeologists had found the marble tomb of St Paul below the altar in the basilica of St Paul-outside-the-walls. (Traditionally it's

claimed that the heads of Sts Peter and St Paul are in two reliquaries in the pope's cathedral basilica of St John Lateran). You can now see through a hole to the tomb below the altar.

Bishops have to visit the tombs of St Peter and St Paul every five years when they meet the Pope for their Ad Limina visit. Obviously it's not essential for our faith to go to Rome, but there's something undeniably special about visiting those two tombs. People like to research their ancestors these days. As Catholics we can certainly have a wonderful sense of our spiritual heritage and the breath-taking plan of Jesus for us all.
