This week I attended a briefing with Julia Coleman (Service Manager School & Provider Standards & Support 0-19 for BCP), which was very informative and supportive with regards to the latest information on Covid 19 in this area. She also sent some information for parents with regards to where you can get practical help within Dorset. I have attached that information with this weekly update.

On a not so happy note I received a call from one of our neighbours this week saying that "some people were jumping on the bonnet of his car and throwing stones at it". I am absolutely certain that he must be mistaken but please could you be observant and make sure that your children do not go near driveways. Thank you very much. We have also received an email from a concerned parent who is worried about the lack of social distancing with groups of people walking together and quite often the older children too near to the younger children along Pound Lane. As we are keeping children in Year Group bubbles in school it is crucial that the whole school community adhere to the minimum 1 metre rule please. Your help with this would be much appreciated, thank you.

We have not had lots of children self isolating but those that have are working hard on the work set for them on 'Google Classrooms'. IXL is going well and children are sharing their certificates. As a school, the children have answered nearly half a million questions! Wow! I am regularly on the programme to see what the children have been doing. Well done to them all.

We had another lovely message from a member of the parish this week and it was lovely that Father John visited school and I was able to meet with him outside.

We have really appreciated the feedback we have received about 'Parent Consultations' which took place this week. There were some suggestions which will help us make it even better in the future eg possibly different year groups on different

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days. The teachers said it was great and they really felt they could give quality time to each family. Only a small % were unable to connect. 
