


## St Mary's Catholic Primary School



This week we received information about 'Dr Bike'. The opportunity to bring your child's bike to school to be serviced. We have called to book a slot and will let you know details in the new year.


Congratulations to Harrison in Year 3 on being awarded these swimming certificates. Great work Harrison!
