Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for coming to coffee morning today! It was lovely to see so many of you there. Please see the coffee morning notes below. If you are able to come with us on our walk to Church to visit Father John, please let us know.

This week the whole school had an afternoon focused on introducing new learning powers. The new learning powers are the 4 R's:resilience, resourcefulness, reflectiveness and relationships. We played lots of team building games that required us to use our new learning powers. We also talked about being resilient in Jigsaw this week. The children shared lots of thoughtful ideas and we decided that we should just keep on trying if we are finding something tricky.

In phonics this week we have been continuing to learn our phase 3 sounds. We have learnt **ur**, **ow** (town), oi and **ear**. We have also learnt a new tricky word **you**. Please continue to practice these sounds and tricky words regularly at home. We have been writing words with our new sounds in during our handwriting practise.

In maths this week we have been learning about one more and one less. We talked about what happens when we add one more or take one away, the children were brilliant at working out the answers practically. We have also been playing lots of games in which we have to say which number is one more or one less. It would be wonderful if you could continue to practise this at home.

Please continue to read with your child every day and send their books back in signed, so that we can change them. If you don't have time to finish then please send the book in anyway with a note in the record to say you haven't finished.

Tapestry challenge

For the tapestry challenge this week we would like to see a picture of the children in any sporting or outdoor activities they take part in at weekend. Whether it be gymnastics, cycling or walking the dog!

- Phonics We have been continuing to learn our phase 3 sounds we have been practising to write our sounds and read words with them in. We have been encouraging the children to begin to write short sentences/captions or lists e.g – The cow is in the barn. The fish and chip shop.
- Tricky words These are words which cannot be sounded out. They just have to be learnt off by heart. Please could you practise these at home we will send out a tricky word mat in their book bag.
- o In **Maths** this week we have been learning about one more and one less. We have also been practising counting backwards from 20 to 0. It will be brilliant if you could practise this at home.
- Tapestry If any parents are having any issues with uploading observations please come and see us and we can help. The children are so happy to share their tapestry challenge each week.
- Homework Your child will have a piece of homework in their book bag this week. They will have a piece of written homework each month.
