Dear Parents and Carers,

I am sure that like us you were absolutely delighted to hear that we will be returning to school on the 8th March. You may also be aware that the Government has advised that those who are Critically Extremely Vulnerable must continue to 'shield' until the 31st March. This means that a number of staff will not be available to return to school on the 8th, including myself. I am currently working with the staff to put together a plan whereby they can still teach the children in school remotely. Whilst this presents many challenges, I am working to ensure that the children will be well supported when they return.

On return to school, there may be some temporary arrangements in place which could include:

teachers teaching live lessons from home, supported by the teaching assistants in class

the use supply teachers in some year groups

As soon as I have the final plan in place I will inform individual year groups affected by this. Please be reassured that there will be a familiar member of staff available for each class.

The Plymouth CAST Risk Assessment is currently being updated and should be with Headteachers by tomorrow. I will carefully work through the document and update it to mitigate the risks for us a school. This will be shared with you once it has been signed off by Plymouth CAST. The plan at the moment is that the children will return to school with the same expectations as we had in September this will include staggered starts and finishes.

As before, there will be a big emphasis on social distancing, hand washing, and ventilation. We would really appreciate it if this week you could remind your child about keeping their distance and remind them to wash their hands thoroughly and regularly. This will really help the staff in school. We would also remind parents that you will need to continue socially distancing from other parents when dropping off and picking up, and would ask that you wear a mask when speaking to school staff.



I know that some of you have found it difficult to get the children motivated to do their remote learning this week and we have seen a decrease in the amount of work being returned. I want to reassure you that we do understand the fatigue that you as parents are feeling, there is just one more week to go so keep your spirits up and enjoy this time with your children, for what we hope will be the last period of home-based learning. Our thoughts are with you.

There has been some wonderful work being produced and we hope there will be even more next week. Let's celebrate:






The independent writing produced in Year 5 from Anna, Jakub and Mirabelle was excellent.






