POOLE FOOD BANK

We're back! Still sorting food - but in a far more organised position than we were a month ago.

I can't thank you enough for your patience and wisdom with your financial support during this period.

Some of you are now asking what food we are short of and having competed our stock take the message is this....

We DO NOT need pasta, soup or baked beans. Any deliveries of these foods will not be wasted, but we will need to store them away for use at some point in the future.

We DO NEED:

Tinned fish (This is by far the biggest need currently)

Longlife Milk (Another big need), Tinned Potatoes, Coffee
Tinned Rice Pudding.

I recognise that some of these items are more expensive than pasta, beans and soup, so it would honestly be better for us at the moment if we were to receive the items that we really need - even if this meant that you donated fewer items (eg. one tin of fish or one jar of coffee instead of a number of cheaper items).

I have just been chatting with one of our visitors this morning whom we have been supporting because of benefit related problems and she told me that she 'literally would not be standing here if it were not for the support that Poole Foodbank has provided over the last few weeks'.

The support has, of course, been provided by yourselves so the HUGEST thank you for partnering with us.

ABOUT TOBY NELMS

Toby Nelms was born in Poole in 1991 and has been a parishioner at St. Mary's Church his whole life. He began playing organ/keyboard at mass from the age of eight and it was an important part of his musical development. He attended both St. Mary's and St. Edward's School through to the age of 18 before being awarded a Henry Wood Scholarship to study at the Royal College of Music.

Toby graduated in 2013 with First Class Honours, becoming the first person in the RCM's history to graduate with a joint principal degree specialising in composition and jazz piano. In recent years as a pianist, Toby has performed at the BBC late night proms, at Clarence House for HRH The Prince of Wales and The London Jazz Festival amongst others. Composition highlights include 1st prize in the Polonsky Foundation Competition for his work 'A Lost Child' and original works played on BBC radio 3.

With changes to peoples habits of paying for all sorts of goods and services, St Mary’s, with the blessing of the diocese, has decided to be one of the pilot churches to introduce contact giving.

Contactless Donations

1. choose your amount. 2. Tap Your Card



3. optionally enter your details for a receipt.



So why go contactless?

This will not replace our usual method of collecting weekly donations to the parish, but rather enhance it. More people than ever no longer carry cash. This will enable you to give to the parish without the usual fumble in bags and pockets and the realisation that you have no cash on you, during the offertory. You will be able to donate as you enter or leave the church.

We will start the contactless payments from next Sunday: you can donate to the parish as you arrive or as you leave. There will be people at the pay stations to assist you should you need it. You can chose to donate one of the set amounts or chose an amount of your own to donate. If you are a tax payer and would like to gift aid your donation you will be asked to input your details, this may take a few moments the first time you do it. Please make sure you have

filled in a gift aid declaration form (if unsure please contact the office).
