#### **First Day Contact**

First day contact will be made with parents/ carers if a child is absent and the reason has not been communicated to school. This should in no way be considered to be intrusive or a nuisance, it is purely to ensure the safety and well-being of all our children.

#### Attendance

Please be aware that the Government class children whose attendance drops below 90% as Persistently Absent.



Therefore, if a child misses 19 or more

days over an academic year they will be classed as Persistently Absent.

## The DfE say...

"If over 5 academic years a pupil has attendance of 90% the child will miss a half of a school year, that's a lot of lost education. Pupils taking unauthorised leave of absence early in the year could be categorised as persistently absent well into half term five but have perfect attendance from their return date onwards.

As parents play an essential role in supporting attendance the changes to persistent absence need to be shared with them"

Last year our figure was 8.85% of children but this year the figure is currently at 9.56%. As a result of this increase we are working closely with the Council's School Attendance Team to try and reduce this figure. If you have received a letter from the school recently we hope that you will work with us and the Local Authority to support you and your child to reduce your child's absences.

Please be aware that Poole have recently fallen in line with the rest of the country with regard to Fixed Penalty Notices for unauthorised holidays in term time and will fine per parent, per child which will double if not paid within the required time frame. We fully understand the frustration and cost implications this law causes but we have to uphold it and so we ask that all parents take care to book their holidays during the school holiday periods.

#### Coughs & sneezes, vomiting bugs etc!

Please may we remind parents and carers of the 48 hour rule— if your child has suffered a tummy upset please do not send him/her to school until 48 hours after the last symptom. If you are aware that sickness has been caused by something other than a bug, (for example too much party food!) please ensure you inform the class teacher as in such instances the 48 hour rule door.

If your child is suffering from a cough,

cold or any illness that allows them to be in school medicated we are happy to administer **prescribed** medicine in school but will ask that you complete a form with detailed instructions beforehand.



Please regularly check your child's hair for nits and treat accordingly, children do not need to stay off school for this.

The school nursing team run drop in sessions at school so please feel free to take advantage of these if you are experiencing any particular

issues.

We are also lucky enough to have a wonderful new Family Outreach Worker, Olivia Prince who will hold drop in sessions at school on the following dates: **Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 9:30 - 10:30**


