I just wanted to remind you of a few key points. The same times for the staggered starts and finishes will apply. I know you will all be trying your very best to ensure that your child arrives within their set time slot to ensure the safety of all the bubbles and I thank you for this. Our Risk Assessment also states that we will remind all parents to go straight home after drop off and pick up. We have replenished the signs on the gates and the staff will hold up sign to let you know which year group can enter through the gate.

As before, there will be a big emphasis on social distancing, hand washing, and ventilation. We would really appreciate it if this weekend you could remind your child about keeping their distance and remind them to wash their hands thoroughly and regularly. This will really help the staff in school. We would also remind parents that you will need to continue socially distancing from other parents when dropping off and picking up, and would ask that you wear a face covering. We have marked a 2 m social distanced line on the outside of the gates to help everyone with remembering to socially distance.

We understand that you will have questions and want to share information with the class teacher but to ensure the safety of everyone we are asking that whilst we are in lockdown that if you have a message to give you send it to school via email. If you need to speak to the class teacher, or any other member of staff, please call the office and they will ring you back as soon as possible. You can also use the buzzer on the gate to leave a message with our office staff for a teacher to contact you. We encourage staff to arrive and leave school promptly to enable a thorough cleaning of the building to take place so this would really help us to ensure this. All the teachers have access to your home numbers after making the welfare calls home so they will most certainly call you back.
