Staying on the topic of bikes we have been asked to share this information with you:


Have YOUR say on new cycle and walking paths and bus improvements proposed for school children, families and local communities. Consultation on south east Dorset's Transforming Cities Fund's remaining two sustainable travel routes proposing major cycling, walking and bus improvements is now live. The two routes are the longest ones in the TCF programme, with 51km of green travel options being proposed, providing environmentally friendly, safer, and healthier journeys to education, work and leisure. Many of the proposed new cycle and walkways are near schools, encouraging children and families to walk, cycle or scoot rather than using the car, particularly for short journeys.

Consultation is now live until 14 June and we're keen to hear from as many schools and parents as possible. You can view plans and complete a survey via


