Stations of The Cross, (the Way of the Cross as it is formally called). We follow Jesus' last hours on earth around the fourteen crosses and images on our church walls. This practice is said to go right back to the first Christians and is really a powerful way of deepening our appreciation for what Jesus does for us. The Stations of the Cross will be at 6.00pm on Fridays and 4.00pm on Sundays in St Mary's and at 7.00pm on Wednesdays at St Anthony's led by different parish groups.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation: the power of Jesus' mercy to cleanse and direct us: Additional to the usual Saturday opportunity, Reconciliation will be available during Holy Hour on Wednesday at St Mary's and before Mass on Thursday mornings at St Anthony's.

Fasting

We heard in the Ash Wednesday gospel reading that Jesus expects his followers to fast. Fasting wakes us up to God. It purifies us spiritually and makes our prayer powerful.

It's good to decide now what we're going to do: give up sweets/biscuits/alcohol/TV/etc. and eat simply on Fridays, remembering especially no meat.

Fasting seems to be making a come-back in western Christianity (it was a Jewish and Christian practice many centuries before Muslims adopted it); it's helpful to start the day with a short prayer asking God to help us fast well and with love so we can be closer to him.
