In towns and cities across the world, people marked the victory with street parties, dancing and singing.

It is an important part of our history and essential that we remind the children of this significant event. This week many children have participated in different activities. Here are some of them to share with you.

Lots of things have been happening including reading comprehensions, bunting, writing invitations, making WW2 planes, Morse Code, drawing of medals, pictures of real medals, poetry, word searches and pictures. Well done everybody.

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























## **VE Day Poem**

No matter the weather,


Money goes to help the poor
