## Maths ideas!

## Please find a selection of games and ideas which will help your child with number skills.

## Play counting games

We are going to count up from 12, take turns to say the numbers.
We are going to count down from 24 , take turns to say the numbers.
We are going to count up from 3, but we can't say any numbers with 5 in them. The children could show numbers with a 5 in a different way, i.e. written down. Make sure to change the starting points.

## Find 5 items

Can you find me 6 pencils?
Can you spot 8 birds in the garden?
Make the children count with you to check, making sure they are counting only one item as they say each number.

## Write the number in letters and numbers

Choose a number e.g. 12. Get the children to write the number in numerals ' 12 ' and letters 'twelve'. Check that the numbers are written correctly. Get the children to test you! And make some mistakes, the children can spot these and correct you.

## Count in $2 \mathrm{~s}, 5 \mathrm{~s}$ and 10 s

Starting from 0 and from other numbers. Count up and down in $2 \mathrm{~s}, 5 \mathrm{~s}$, and 10 s .

## Hot potato

Play catch with a ball, each time you catch say a number, e.g. 5, 10, 15. Make mistakes, and get the children to correct you. They will love this!

Do the same as hot potato, useful when you don't have a ball!

## Number bonds to 10

You say a number, for example ' 3 ', the children give its partner number to make 10 , for example ' 7 '. You could also make cards to test each other with, writing one number on each side of the card.

## Number bonds to 20

You say a number, for example ' 6 ', the children give its partner number to make 10 , for example ' 14 '. You could also make cards to test each other with, writing one number on each side of the card.

## Longer or shorter

The children choose an item for example a pencil, you ask them if they can find something longer or shorter. The children choose an item, for example a door, you ask them if they can find something taller or smaller.
