





Dear Parents and Carers,

This week once again there have been lots of changes to the guidelines that we all have to follow. I wanted to thank you all for remembering to socially distance outside of the school when waiting for your child. It is a great help that you are all arriving and leaving promptly. As of Monday you will notice a few changes within school. Plymouth CAST are directing that all staff and visitors in their primary schools to wear a face covering whilst outside the classroom in communal areas/corridors etc in the same way that they would in a shop or on public transport. This means that when the children arrive in school and are collected from the school the staff will be wearing face coverings. This important change has been shared with all the children today so that they are prepared for Monday.
