Phonics

The Read, Write, Inc lessons began this week in Key Stage One and have been well received by the children. Here are some

The training has begun for the Accelerated Reader scheme: Mrs Wrann, Miss Morris and Mr Thomas have had two online training sessions introducing them to Accelerated Reader which will allow us to guide and track **all** pupils in their book choices, linked appropriately to their reading skills. We are now awaiting labels for all our book stock and they are setting up the assessment system. One class will be trialling an assessment this week so that the next training session can take place.
