I am pleased to report that Mr Simon Thomas will be seconded to us as the 'Acting Deputy' from Monday 18th March 2019. Mr Thomas has a wealth of school experience and was previously a senior leader at Oakdale Junior School. More recently he has been the Year 2 teacher at Court Hill Infants School.
