Year 4: Earthquakes and Volcanoes - Why are some earthquakes more damaging than others?


Year 5: Earth, Sun and Moon

Year 6: Ancient Greece
















As you will be aware the rules for isolation following a positive result for COVID have changed and self-isolation can end on day 7 if there have been 2 negative LFT tests, one on day 6 and one on day 7. The chart below will help to understand this.

Examples of when to end self-isolation if you have had COVID-19 symptoms or have received a positive COVID-19 test result



If you are classed as a close contact then you will receive a different letter from school than previously. This letter will advise you that your child should take rapid lateral flow device (LFD) tests at home every day for 7 days, or until 10 days since your last contact with the person who tested positive for COVID-19 if this is earlier. They can continue to come to school as long as your LFD results remain negative.

LFD Tests are easy to order online when they are available. I managed to order a set this lunchtime easily and they are being delivered to home. https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-test

Please can I remind you all that do have a number of staff and children that are allergic to 'Nuts and Sesame'.


