Message from Mrs Armstrong

Another academic year has flown by at St. Mary's with lots of adventures along the way. September seems such a long time ago, but we returned to school with lots of energy. All our children including the new foundation children soon settled into a busy school life.

All children and staff have worked extremely hard over the year and we are very proud of their achievements. We have been challenged and held to account along the way by the Education and Standards Manager (ESM), Helen Brown, from Plymouth CAST. Last week she was in school reviewing the outcomes across the school for 2017-2018, setting actions for different stakeholders to complete in the new term. Since May half term we have been trialling a new feedback and marking policy which aims to reduce teacher workload, whilst at the same time ensuring all children are making progress. The ESM scrutinised books and made lots of good suggestions as to how we can move forward with this system in September. As a school, we have been asked by the Director of Education for Plymouth CAST, Louise Adams, to share our marking and Feedback policy with other schools within CAST.

All the year groups have participated in many exciting curriculum related activities this year. The Foundation children have benefitted from a child initiated curriculum and it has been fun observing them watch caterpillars turn into butterflies, take part in a tea party for the royal wedding and enjoy a visit from the 'Evil Pea'. Our Year One children have enjoyed finding out about castles, plants and materials, whilst enjoying a visit to Poole Park. Year 2 began the year with a visit to Brownsea Island to think about life on an island and ended the year with a trip to Avon Heath where they learnt about different habitats.

Year 3 enjoyed learning to swim in their PE lessons. They participated in a trip to the New Forest Wildlife Park and more recently to Kimmeridge. Year 4 began with a trip to Paultons Park, the mummifying of fish, cooking and art weeks have been great fun when studying the Tudors and Egyptians. A successful residential to Leeson House ended the first term for Year 5 and since then they have had great fun studying the Street Child and have enjoyed a visit to the Safe Wise centre. Year 6 have risen to the challenge, they have studied a variety of topics over the year and as always, enjoyed studying the Greeks. This culminated in a great residential to PGL in Osmington Bay.

As we look back on the year we remember the science days, the musical events and sporting events of which there are too many to mentions. Lots of opportunities for the children to become involved in the arts as well our careers event, 'Inspire to Learn'.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the children for working hard, the parents for supporting your children and us as a school, all the staff and Governors who have worked tirelessly to ensure that the children experience the best education possible.

We hope to see even more children achieving their gold medals next year!


Wire sculpture workshop with artist Denise Poote
