Thank you to all those who took the time to complete the parent survey last term. Below are the outcomes from questions 1-5 in the survey:




Keeping children happy in school is our primary concern. Happy children learnt best. Try asking your child what they enjoyed or what they are grateful for when they get home – this helps to build a positive mind set. If you child is not happy for any reason please tell the class teacher in the first instance. If it is not sorted the phase leader should be contacted.






Keeping children safe is paramount. Our recent NSPCC assemblies have focused on enabling children to know what is safe and what is unsafe behaviour. Our PSHE leader has worked this year with the teachers to map out safeguarding themes across our curriculum. These include ESafety, stranger danger and knowing what good relationships are.



Our 8 Bs (values) are at the heart of our behaviour policy – if you have not read our new behaviour policy please do download it from our website.



Bullying is repeated unkind behaviour targeted at a child, this can take many forms including verbal and non verbal actions or written messages, Monitoring your child's online access on mobile phones or other devices is a essential to avoid cyber bullying. Our anti bullying policy can be downloaded from our website for more information. If you believe that your child is being bullied, you must report it immediately to the class teacher.



Look out for the half termly year group newsletters which are sent home on DoJo or Tapestry – these inform parents of the learning in each year group. If you want to know more then please check out the curriculum pages on our web.


This term we have report cards going home which will give parents a clear indication of how well your child is doing in their learning.

Holidays in Term Time

Holidays during term time cannot be authorised and we please ask that, in particular, no holidays are booked during May and June when all year groups are taking part in assessments.

Summer Uniform

We really pride ourselves on high standards at St Mary's School and we politely ask that pupils only wear school PE uniform on PE days. Navy track suit bottoms or shorts are acceptable please – not black or logo leggings.

Sun Safety

When the summer really starts to get going we advise all pupils to have a named sun hat or cap. Please ensure you apply sun cream to pupils before school. We are unable to apply suncream on your behalf so this is crucial. We would also ask you to encourage your child to drink plenty of water throughout the day, they can always ask an adult to refill their bottle!

On 23rd May *Escapeline*, a charity that works to protect children and young people for criminal and sexual exploitation, will be visiting school to lead workshops for pupils in KS2, for staff and for parents. The parent workshop would be well worth attending. A letter will be sent out next week with full details.

Thank you to the NSPCC and their volunteers for supporting our mission to empower children to speak out and stay safe! Please do talk to your children about the online assembly to reinforce the message that they should tell a grown up if they feel unsafe or worried about something.

In the online assembly, the *Speak out. Stay safe.* messages were delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec. Following-on from the assembly, the specially trained NSPCC volunteers delivered a workshop to our Year 5 children that builds on and deepens pupils' learning gained from the assembly.

Assessment Information

Key Stage 2 statutory assessments begin Tuesday 9th May – Friday 12th May, in English and Maths.

Key Stage 2 assessments in writing and Science assessments continue until the end of June.

Key Stage 1 statutory assessments begin 3rd May until the 19th May in reading and maths.

Key Stage 1 assessments in writing continue until the end of June.

Key stage 1 phonics assessment begin on 12th June.

Year 4 Times Table assessments begin on 5th June for two weeks.

Foundation Stage profile continue until 30th June.

Teachers have already shared information with parents regarding these assessments and any further information will be communicated via class Dojo or Tapestry. It is imperative that

we maximise learning time for all of our pupils, so please avoid absences unless a child is unwell.
