As 2020 starts with fires burning in Australia, and millions on the brink of starvation in Southern Africa CAFOD challenges us to make small changes for the New Year to help combat climate change.

We will be sharing the CAFOD messages around reduce reuse recycle, and other actions we could take to make the world a better place for all to live in.

CAFOD LAUNCHES URGENT APPEAL FOR MILLIONS OF FAMILIES FACING HUNGER IN ZIMBABWE AND ZAMBIA

The recent Cyclone Idai, are pushing families to the brink of starvation. Last year's harvests failed, largely due to extreme weather, from droughts that lasted for months on end, to flooding which wiped out whole villages.

"The cost of food has risen exponentially, and there are severe bread shortages across the country. Where it can be found, a loaf of bread in Zimbabwe now costs up to fifteen times more than it did a year ago. In the struggle to feed their children, parents are going without themselves.

"The prolonged drought means dams have failed to fill. Wells and rivers are drying up, leaving communities with no option but to walk tens of kilometres to reach water."
