Picturing Divine Mercy

Listen out for the opening prayer at mass this Sunday: it refers to the water and blood of Jesus.

The themes of water and blood run all the way through St John's Gospel, from the Samaritan woman at the well, to Jesus' teaching on his Body and Blood. After Jesus' death, St John says he himself watches blood and water come from Jesus' side on the cross. Water is seen to stand for the cleansing forgiveness of baptism and blood the nourishing life of Jesus for us in Holy Communion.

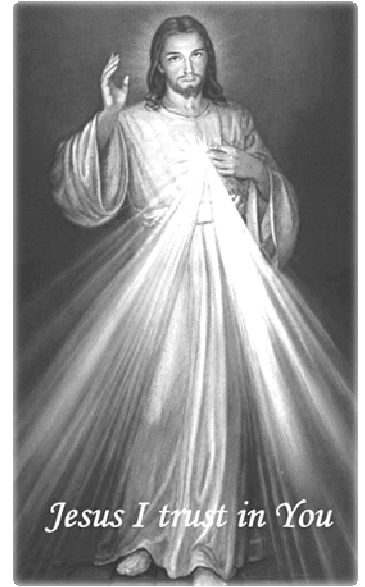
Wherever we go into a Catholic Church now we are likely to find an image of Jesus with red and white rays coming from his side. But these images are a very recent phenomenon; they originate in the writings of St Faustina, the 'apostle of mercy' who died in 1938. Jesus asked her to have an image painted according to his instruction. She wrote his words in her diary in 1934:

"I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death. I myself will defend it as my own glory....the two rays denote blood and water. The pale ray stands for the water which makes souls righteous. The red ray stands for the Blood which is the life of souls".

We live in a world saturated with images; they can work so powerfully on us. Our Lord knows the way we work; he knows good imagery can also have a tremendous force in our lives. Having a picture of him to counteract all that seeks to drag us down makes sense – even if it might not be artistically perfect!

Here are some further words of Our Lord:

"I am giving you three ways of exercising mercy toward your neighbour: the first by deed, the second by word, the third by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy and it is an unquestionable proof of love for me. By this means a soul glorifies and pays reverence to my mercy. Yes, the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also be acts of mercy, and I demand the worship of my mercy through the solemn celebration of the feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of my mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works".
