
Dear Parents and Carers,


The Year 6 children have begun a new novel. Clockwork by Philip Pullman.

The East Dorset Cluster have met twice this week. On Monday all the teachers from the 4 schools met to moderate writing and then on Thursday we had some Maths CPD for Maths Leads, Year 2 and Year 6 teachers. Our special thanks go to Mr Lobo and Miss Waters from St. Patrick's Catholic Primary School in Southampton for providing such high quality CPD.























Sunday will be the first Sunday in Advent. In preparation for this the Mini Vinnies led our first Advent Liturgy today. They shared with us that since circles have no beginning and no end, the circular shape of the Advent Wreath is used to symbolise God the Father and eternal life.

Our wreath holds five candles, four of which are lit over the four weeks of Advent and the white one which is lit on Christmas Day. There are three violet candles and one rose candle and a white candle in the centre. The lighting of the Advent candles represents the promise of the coming of Jesus, the light of the world. The first Sunday of Advent symbolises Hope with the Prophet's Candle reminding us that Jesus is coming. Today we lit the first candle. Advent is no longer considered a Penitential season, rather a time of joyful expectation.

I hope you all experience much joy during this Advent.
