






During the months of pregnancy your baby's brain grows with astonishing speed.




When a baby is born his brain is approximately 100 billion neurons (electrical nerve cells), which is about the same number as the stars that make up the

milky way






A baby is born with all the wiring in place. You need to provide the switches


Healthy early development depends on nurturing and dependable relationships.






Babies' brains at 0 and 3 months old
